

## Legal Alert: guaranteed minimum income and extension of leave in case of death

## Obligation to apply for the "guaranteed minimum income" (Law No. 21.218):

As of May 2022, employers will have the obligation to apply, in a monthly basis, those employees with a gross salary of less than \$452,477 CLP (approx. USD 530) to the "guarantee minimum income" policy, which will grant the employees to a subsidy paid by the government. Also, all the employees with such salary must be informed about the existence of this benefit policy.

The purpose of this public policy is to guarantee employees a liquid amount salary of \$340,817 CLP (approx. USD 400) and the aforementioned application must be made on: <a href="https://www.ingresominimo.cl/">https://www.ingresominimo.cl/</a>, no later than the 15th of each month.

If for technical reasons the company is not able to apply on the indicated date, the employees can apply for themselves from the 16th of the month with their unique access code for governmental procedures (*clave única del Estado*). In such case, the company must provide the employees with a primer with the official information available on the indicated platform.

It is reminded that it is not possible to reduce the salaries of employees benefiting from this subsidy.

In case the company does not fulfill this monthly obligation, it will be exposed to fines ranging from 5 to 60 monthly tax units, depending on the size of the company.

## Extension of leave in case parents and siblings deaths (Law No. 21,441):

On May 9, 2022, Law No. 21.441 was published in the Official Gazette, which amends the Labor Code by extending the leave

in case of death of the employee's father or mother from three to four working days. Likewise, from now on, the death of a

brother or sister also authorizes the employee to make use of this benefit for the same period.
