# "Unfair Competition Law": Reestablishment of legal action in favor of small enterprises

On **July 4th 2019**, Law No. 21,166 was published which reintroduces under Law No. 20,169 regarding unfair competition, **the power of small enterprises** to sue, either on their own, collectively or via guild representation, for damages that were caused by unfair competition practices enumerated in article 4° of Law 20,169.

#### Unfair Competition Practices

It should be recalled that Law N° 21,131, also called "Law for Payment within 30 Days", introduced the following as unfair competition practices:

- a) The establishment or use of contractual clauses or abusive conduct to the detriment of suppliers;
- b) The systematic breach of contractual commitments to suppliers; and
- c) The systematic failure to meet deadlines set out in Law N

  19,983 that Regulates the Transfer and Grants Direct Enforcement of the Copy of an Invoice, ensuring the fulfillment of payment obligations for unpaid invoice balances.

#### Small Enterprises

Law N° 20,416 which Sets Special Standards for Small Enterprises, identifies as a small enterprise the following:

- a) Microenterprises: companies whose annual revenue from sales, services, and other commercial activities does not exceed 2,400 Unidades de Fomento during the last calendar year;
- b) Small companies: whose annual revenue from sales, services, and other commercial activities exceeds 2,400 Unidades de Fomento and does not surpass 25,000 Unidades de Fomento during the last calendar year; and
- c) Medium-sized companies: whose annual revenue from sales, services, and other commercial activities exceeds 25,000 Unidades de Fomento and does not surpass 100,000 Unidades de Fomento during the last calendar year.
